BIOGRAPHY

Born in 1946, Leon Krier has taught architecture and urbanism at the Royal College of Arts in London, and in the United States at Princeton University, Yale University, the Univ. of Notre Dame & the Univ. of Virginia. He has worked extensively in Europe and North America and consults on projects in Guatemala, Romania, England, Belgium, Italy, France, and the United States. In 2003, he received the inaugural Richard Driehaus Prize for Classical Architecture.

Leon Krier is one of the best-known, most influential architects and urban theoreticians in the world. In *The Architecture of Community* he refines and updates his thinking on the making of sustainable, humane, and attractive villages, towns, and cities. The book includes drawings, diagrams, and photographs of his works, which have not been widely seen until now.

The Architecture of Community provides a contemporary road map for designing or completing today's fragmented communities.

Illustrated throughout with Krier's original drawings, *The Architecture of Community* explains his theories on classical and vernacular urbanism and architecture, while providing practical design guidelines for creating livable towns.

Projects include:

- The Krier House and Tower, Seaside, FL
- Town of Poundbury in England. Commissioned by the Prince of Wales in 1988, Krier's design for Poundbury in Dorset has become a reference model for ecological planning and building that can meet contemporary needs.
